First call for participation

Analysing discourse is an enterprise that should take into account whose voices are heard and whose are unheard and what is *sayable* and *visible*, as well as *unsayable* and *invisible* under specific orders of discourse. Silencing is a consequence of the stratification of speakers, discourses and (named) languages according to evolving legitimate models of speakerhood, citizenship, and mobility. A reflection on the connection between voices and silences/silencing can illuminate the social relations of power in given contexts and the conditions of knowledge generation that we, as discourse analysts, are subject to. The *IV Ediso International Symposium* seeks to foreground the unsaid, the invisible, and the unheard, as a way to understand compliance, conflict, resistance and even subversion to dominant discursive, sociolinguistic and economic orders in late modernity

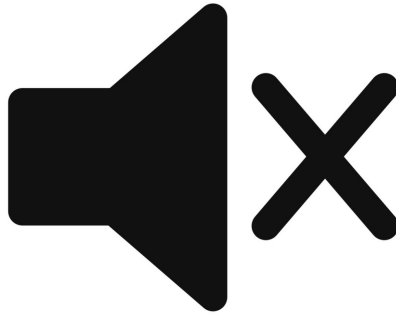
We especially welcome panels, workshops, roundtables and individual contributions on the following topics:

Your proposal should include the following items:

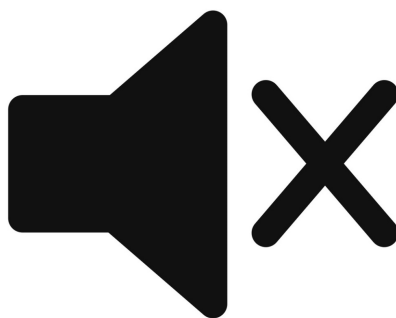
- 1- Type of activity: thematic panel, data analysis workshop, roundtable, other kinds of thematic sessions.
- 2- Coordinator(s).
- 3- Title.
- 4- Activity description: abstract, aims, focus, and methodology (3000 characters with spaces, max.)
- 5- Total number of expected participants.
- 6- List of participants if closed, or clear indication that a panel is open to contributions (2nd call for contributions). Coordinators will be responsible for integration of open contributions in their own thematic sessions.

Proposals will be assessed by the EDiSo Scientific Committee, according to relevance, original contribution to the field, and degree of engagement with the main theme and the aims of EDiSo.
